

Rebecca Allen is a Professor of Education at the UCL Institute of Education.

An economist by training and former secondary school teacher, she is an expert in the analysis of large datasets. Her research explores how schools respond to changes in government policy, with a particular focus on school accountability and teacher labour markets.

Between 2014 and 2017, she founded and led Education Datalab. In 2017, she co-founded an app for teachers called Teacher Tapp, which is already the largest teacher survey in the UK. Her book on teacher careers called ‘The Teacher Gap’ was published last year.



Gareth Evans is Director of Education Policy at Yr Athrofa: Institute of Education, University of Wales

A former journalist, Gareth was Education Editor at Wales’ national newspaper, The Western Mail, for almost 10 years during which he became the only specialist to work alongside four different Education Ministers. As well as analysing, scrutinising and contributing to education policy in Wales, he now works with schools and other key stakeholders to help in its successful implementation. A regular commentator in national print and broadcast media, Gareth’s book ‘A Class Apart: Learning the Lessons of Education in Post-Devolution Wales’ was published to critical acclaim in 2015 by Welsh Academic Press. He has contributed to numerous conferences over several years and his current research activity relates to professional learning of the education workforce and accountability in schools.
